BLUETONGUE: ESSENTIAL FACTS

- Over 4,000 cases of BTV-3 reported in the Netherlands, Germany and Belgium since May 2024. Cases also reported in France, Luxemburg and Denmark for the first time.
- 97 cases in England since 26th August 2024.
- BTV-3 affects cattle, sheep, goats, deer and camelids.
- Spread by midges but ONLY when temperatures are above 12°c.
- Symptoms vary across ruminants, but include:
 - Fever
 - Lesions
 - Redness of the mouth, eyes & nose
 - Reddening of the skin above the hoof
 - Excessive salivation & nasal discharge.
 - However, some animals may show little or no clinical signs.
- It is a Notifiable Disease; cases MUST be reported by calling APHA on 03000 200 301.
- The Bluetongue control zone runs up the Eastern side of England from the South Coast to East Riding of Yorkshire.
- Defra has permitted the use of 3 'unauthorised' vaccines which only claim reduction or prevention of clinical signs and mortality rates. These vaccines are POM-V and can only be prescribed by a vet.
- Look out for signs and plan ahead to protect your business source livestock responsibly.

BIRD FLU: POULTRY KEEPERS

All bird keepers must register their birds with the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) by 1st October 2024. This applies to **ALL bird keepers** regardless of numbers and includes pets/small flocks. This can be done by emailing customer.registration@apha.gov.uk, phoning APHA on 03000 200 301 or online at Register as a keeper of less than 50 poultry or other captive birds - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

DELINKED PAYMENTS

The RPA are expecting to start making the second (final) 2024 instalment of the delinked payment from the 30^{th} September 2024. This has been brought forward from the 1^{st} December to help farmers with cash flow after the difficult weather. Payment of the first instalment began on the 1^{st} August.
